





Control panel layout



- 1 Control-panel display: The display provides information about the product. Use the menus on the display to establish product settings.
- 2 Attention light (amber): The Attention light blinks when the product requires user attention.
- 3 Ready light (green): The Ready light is on when the product is ready to print. It blinks when the product is receiving print data, or when the product is in sleep mode.
- 4 Back ♠ button: Use this button for the following actions:
 - Exit the control-panel menus.
 - Scroll back to a previous menu in a submenu list.
 - Scroll back to a previous menu item in a submenu list (without saving changes to the menu item).
- 5 Cancel \(\sum \) button: Press this button to cancel a print job whenever the attention light is blinking or to exit the control-panel menus.
- 6 Left arrow **♦** button: Use this button to navigate through the menus or to decrease a value that appears on the display.
- 7 OK button: Press the OK button for the following actions:
 - Open the control-panel menus.
 - Open a submenu displayed on the control-panel display.
 - Select a menu item.
 - Clear some errors.
 - Begin a print job in response to a control-panel prompt (for example, when the message Press OK to continue appears on the control-panel display).
- 8 Right arrow button: Use this button to navigate through the menus or to increase a value that appears on the display.
- ePrint button: This button provides quick access to HP ePrint features. HP ePrint is a tool that prints documents by using any email-enabled device to send them to the product email address.

10 On/off button: This button provides power to the product.

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Load Tray 1 (multipurpose tray)


NOTE: Tray 1 holds up to 100 sheets of paper, up to 75 transparencies, up to 50 sheets of labels, or up to 10 envelopes. It supports cut sheet paper weight 60–199 g/m² (16–53 lb); labels and transparencies 0.10 to 0.14 mm thick (4.7 to 5 mils thick); envelopes weight 60 to 90 g/m² (16 to 24 lb); and postcards weight 135 to 176 g/m² (36-47 lb).

 Open Tray 1 by grasping the handles on each side of the tray and pulling down.






Load the paper into the tray. Make sure that the paper fits under the tabs and below the maximum-height indicators.

6. Adjust the paper guides so that they lightly touch the paper stack but do not bend the paper.



NOTE: To avoid jams, do not add paper to Tray 1 while the product is printing. Do not close Tray 1 while the product is printing.



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Load Tray 2


Tray 2 holds up to 250 sheets of 75 g/m² (20 lb) paper. If the paper is heavier, the tray does not hold as many sheets. Do not overfill the tray. It supports cut sheet paper weight 60–120 g/m² (16–32 lb).


CAUTION: Do not print envelopes, labels, or unsupported sizes of paper from Tray 2. Print these types of paper only from Tray 1.

1. Pull the tray out and lift up slightly to remove it completely from the product.

NOTE: Do not open the tray while it is in use.





3. If you are loading B4, A3, 11 x 17, Legal, or Oficio 8.5 x 13 size paper, unlock the rear tray guide using the slide lock at the back of the tray.



Adjust the tray length to the correct paper size.




Load paper into the tray. Check the paper to make sure the guides lightly touch the stack, but do not bend the paper.

The way you should orient the paper in the tray varies depending on the paper size. For additional information, see Tray 2 paper orientation on page 18.

NOTE: To prevent jams, do not overfill the tray. Be sure the top of the stack is below the tray full indicator.

NOTE: If the tray is not adjusted correctly, an error message might display during printing or the paper might jam.


Optional Tray 3 holds up to 500 sheets of 75 g/m² (20 lb) paper. If the paper is heavier, the tray does not hold as many sheets. Do not overfill the tray. It supports cut sheet paper weight 60–120 g/m² (16–32 lb).

Replace the toner cartridge


When a toner cartridge approaches the end of useful life, you are prompted to order a replacement. You can continue printing with the current cartridge until redistributing the toner no longer yields acceptable print quality.

The following illustration shows the toner-cartridge components.



1	Imaging drum (Be careful not to touch the imaging drum.)	
2	Memory chip	
3	Sealing tape	


1. Open the front door.



2. Remove the used toner cartridge.



 Remove the new toner cartridge from the bag. Place the used toner cartridge in the bag for recycling.




 Grasp both sides of the toner cartridge and distribute the toner by gently rocking the cartridge.

CAUTION: Do not touch the imaging drum.



5. Remove the sealing tape. Bend the tab on the left side of the cartridge until the tab breaks loose. Pull the tab until all the tape is removed from the cartridge. Place the tab and tape in the tonercartridge box to return for recycling.



Align the toner cartridge with the tracks inside the product, insert the toner cartridge until it is firmly seated.

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

How to print (Windows)


The following procedure describes the basic printing process for Windows.

- 1. From the software program, select the **Print** option.
- Select the product from the list of printers. To change settings, click or tap the **Properties** or **Preferences** button to open the print driver.
 - NOTE: The name of the button varies for different software programs.



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3. Click or tap the tabs in the print driver to configure the available options. For example, set the paper orientation on the **Finishing** tab, and set the paper source, paper type, paper size, and quality settings on the **Paper/Quality** tab.



- **4.** Click or tap the **OK** button to return to the **Print** dialog box. Select the number of copies to print from this screen.
- 5. Click or tap the **OK** button to print the job.

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Automatically print on both sides (Windows)

Use this procedure for products that have an automatic duplexer installed. If the product does not have an automatic duplexer installed, or to print on paper types that the duplexer does not support, you can print on both sides manually.

- 1. From the software program, select the **Print** option.
- Select the product from the list of printers, and then click or tap the **Properties** or **Preferences** button to open the print driver.
- NOTE: The name of the button varies for different software programs.
- Click or tap the Finishing tab.
- Select the Print on both sides check box. Click the OK button to close the Document Properties dialog box.
- 5. In the **Print** dialog box, click the **OK** button to print the job.

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Manually print on both sides (Windows)

Use this procedure for products that do not have an automatic duplexer installed or to print on paper that the duplexer does not support.

- 1. From the software program, select the **Print** option.
- Select the product from the list of printers, and then click or tap the **Properties** or **Preferences** button to open the print driver.
- **NOTE:** The name of the button varies for different software programs.
- 3. Click or tap the **Finishing** tab.
- Select the Print on both sides (manually) check box. Click the OK button to print the first side of the job.
- 5. Retrieve the printed stack from the output bin, and place it in Tray 1.
- **6.** If prompted, touch the appropriate control panel button to continue.

How to print (Mac OS X)

The following procedure describes the basic printing process for Mac OS X.

- 1. Click the **File** menu, and then click the **Print** option.
- 2. In the **Printer** menu, select the product.
- Open the menus drop-down list or click Show Details, and then select other menus to adjust the print settings.
- 4. Click the **Print** button.

Automatically print on both sides (Mac OS X)

NOTE: This feature is available if you install the HP print driver. It might not be available if you are using AirPrint.

- 1. Click the **File** menu, and then click the **Print** option.
- 2. In the **Printer** menu, select the product.
- Open the menus drop-down list or click Show Details, and then click the Layout menu.
- Select a binding option from the **Two-Sided** drop-down list.
- 5. Click the **Print** button.

Manually print on both sides (Mac OS X)

- 6. From the **Borders** menu, select the type of border to print around each page on the sheet.

HP ePrint via email

Use HP ePrint to print documents by sending them as an email attachment to the product's email address from any email enabled device.

To use HP ePrint, the product must meet these requirements:

- The product must be connected to a wired network and have Internet access.
- HP Web Services must be enabled on the product, and the product must be registered with HP Connected.
 - 1. On the product control panel, press the OK button.
 - **2.** Scroll to the **HP Web Services** menu, and press the **OK** button.
 - **3.** Scroll to the **Print Information Sheet** option, and press the **OK** button.

HP ePrint software

The HP ePrint software makes it easy to print from a Windows or Mac desktop or laptop computer to any HP ePrint-capable product. This software makes it easy to find HP ePrint-enabled products that are registered to your HP Connected account. The target HP printer can be located in the office or at locations across the globe.

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- Windows: After installing the software, open the Print option from within your application, and then select HP ePrint from the installed printers list. Click the Properties button to configure print options.
- **Mac:** After installing the software, select **File**, **Print**, and then select the arrow next to **PDF** (in the bottom left of the driver screen). Select **HP ePrint**.





Restore the factory-set defaults

Restoring the factory-set defaults returns all of the product and network settings to the factory defaults. It will not reset the page count, tray size, or language. To restore the product to the factory-default settings, follow these steps.

<u>CAUTION:</u> Restoring the factory-set defaults returns all of the settings to the factory defaults, and it also deletes any pages that are stored in the memory. The procedure then automatically restarts the product.

- 1. On the product control panel, press the OK button to open the menus.
- 2. Open the following menus:
 - Service
 - Restore Defaults

The product automatically restarts.

A "Cartridge is low" or "Cartridge is very low" message displays on the product control panel

Cartridge is low: The product indicates when a toner cartridge level is low. Actual toner cartridge life remaining may vary. Consider having a replacement available to install when print quality is no longer acceptable. The toner cartridge does not need to be replaced now.

Cartridge is very low: The product indicates when the toner cartridge level is very low. Actual toner cartridge life remaining may vary. Consider having a replacement available to install when print quality is no longer acceptable. The toner cartridge does not need to be replaced now unless the print quality is no longer acceptable.

Once an HP toner cartridge has reached **Very Low**, HP's Premium Protection Warranty on that toner cartridge has ended.

Change the "Very Low" settings

Use the product control panel to change the way the product reacts when supplies reach the Very Low state. It is not necessary to re-establish these settings after installing a new toner cartridge.

Product does not pick up paper or misfeeds

The product does not pick up paper

If the product does not pick up paper from the tray, try these solutions.

- 1. Open the product and remove any jammed sheets of paper.
- **2.** Load the tray with the correct size of paper for your job.
- 3. Make sure the paper size and type are set correctly on the product control panel.
- 4. Make sure the paper guides in the tray are adjusted correctly for the size of paper. Adjust the guides to the appropriate indentation in the tray.
- 5. Check the product control panel to see if the product is waiting for you to acknowledge a prompt to feed the paper manually. Load paper, and continue.
- The rollers above the tray might be contaminated. Clean the rollers with a lint-free cloth dampened with warm water.

The product picks up multiple sheets of paper

If the product picks up multiple sheets of paper from the tray, try these solutions.


- Remove the stack of paper from the tray and flex it, rotate it 180 degrees, and flip it over. Do not fan the paper. Return the stack of paper to the tray.
- 2. Use only paper that meets HP specifications for this product.
- 3. Use paper that is not wrinkled, folded, or damaged. If necessary, use paper from a different package.
- **4.** Make sure the tray is not overfilled. If it is, remove the entire stack of paper from the tray, straighten the stack, and then return some of the paper to the tray.
- 5. Make sure the paper guides in the tray are adjusted correctly for the size of paper. Adjust the guides to the appropriate indentation in the tray.
- 6. Make sure the printing environment is within recommended specifications.

Clear jams

Jam locations

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Jams can occur in these locations:



Loose toner might remain in the product after a jam. This problem typically resolves itself after a few sheets have been printed.

Experiencing frequent or recurring paper jams?

To reduce the number of paper jams, try these solutions.

- 1. Use only paper that meets HP specifications for this product.
- 2. Use paper that is not wrinkled, folded, or damaged. If necessary, use paper from a different package.
- 3. Use paper that has not previously been printed or copied on.
- 4. Make sure the tray is not overfilled. If it is, remove the entire stack of paper from the tray, straighten the stack, and then return some of the paper to the tray.
- 5. Make sure the paper guides in the tray are adjusted correctly for the size of paper. Adjust the guides so they are touching the paper stack without bending it.
- 6. Make sure that the tray is fully inserted in the product.

- 7. If you are printing on heavy, embossed, or perforated paper, use the manual feed feature and feed sheets one at a time.
- 8. Verify that the tray is configured correctly for the paper type and size.
 - **a.** On the product control panel, press the OK button.
 - **b.** Open the following menus:

 - Paper Setup
 - c. Verify the tray is configured for the paper type and size.
- 9. Make sure the printing environment is within recommended specifications.

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2. Remove the toner cartridge.



Lift the jam-plate and carefully remove any jammed paper. Use both hands to remove jammed paper to avoid tearing.



4. Reinsert the toner cartridge.




5. Close the front door.

4. Close the rear door.




Clear jams in the optional duplexer (M706n model only)

1. Remove the duplexer.



2. Remove any paper from the duplexer.



3. Reinstall the duplexer.

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Improve print quality

If the product is having print-quality problems, try the following solutions in the order presented to resolve the issue.

- Print from a different software program
- Check the paper-type setting for the print job
- Check the toner-cartridge status
- Print a cleaning page
- Visually inspect the toner cartridge for damage
- Check paper and the printing environment
- Check other print job settings
- Try a different print driver

Print from a different software program

Try printing from a different software program. If the page prints correctly, the problem is with the software program from which the page was printed.

Check the paper-type setting for the print job

Check the paper type setting when printing from a software program and the printed pages have smears, fuzzy or dark print, curled paper, scattered dots of toner, loose toner, or small areas of missing toner.

Check the paper type setting (Windows)

- From the software program, select the **Print** option.
- 2. Select the product, and then click the **Properties** or **Preferences** button.
- 3. Click the Paper/Quality tab.
- 4. From the **Paper Type** drop-down list, click the **More...** option.
- 5. Expand the list of **Type is:** options.
- Expand the category of paper types that best describes your paper.
- 7. Select the option for the type of paper being used, and click the **OK** button.
- Click the **OK** button to close the **Document Properties** dialog box. In the **Print** dialog box, click the **OK** button to print the job.

Check the paper type setting (Mac OS X)

- 1. Click the **File** menu, and then click the **Print** option.
- 2. In the **Printer** menu, select the product.
- 3. By default, the print driver displays the **Copies & Pages** menu. Open the menus drop-down list, and then click the **Finishing** menu.

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- 4. Select a type from the **Media Type** drop-down list.
- Click the **Print** button.

Check the toner-cartridge status

Check the supplies status page for the following information:

- Estimated percentage of cartridge life remaining
- Approximate pages remaining
- Part numbers for HP toner cartridges
- Number of pages printed

Use the following procedure to print the supplies status page:

- On the product control panel, press the OK button.
- Scroll to the **Reports** menu, and press the OK button.
- Scroll to the Supplies Status option, and then press the OK button to print a report of the status of all supply items.
- **4.** Check the percent of life remaining for the toner cartridge and if applicable, the status of other replaceable maintenance parts.

Print quality problems can occur when using a toner cartridge that is at its estimated end of life. The supplies status page indicates when a supply level is very low. After an HP supply has reached the very low threshold, HP's premium protection warranty on that supply has ended.

The toner cartridge does not need to be replaced now unless the print quality is no longer acceptable. Consider having a replacement available to install when print quality is no longer acceptable.

If a toner cartridge or other replaceable maintenance part needs to be replaced, the supplies status page lists the genuine HP part numbers.

Check to see if a genuine HP cartridge is installed.

A genuine HP toner cartridge has the words "HP" or "Hewlett-Packard" on it, or has the HP logo on it. For more information on identifying HP cartridges go to www.hp.com/go/learnaboutsupplies.

Hewlett-Packard cannot recommend the use of non-HP supplies, either new or remanufactured. Because they are not HP products, HP cannot influence their design or control their quality. If you are using a refilled or remanufactured toner cartridge and are not satisfied with the print quality, replace the toner cartridge with a genuine HP toner cartridge.

Print a cleaning page

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During the printing process paper, toner, and dust particles can accumulate inside the product and can cause print-quality issues such as toner specks or spatter, smears, streaks, lines, or repeating marks.

Follow these steps to clean the product's paper path.

- 1. On the product control panel, press the OK button.
- **2.** Scroll to the **Service** menu, and press the **OK** button.
- 3. Scroll to the **Cleaning Page** option, and press the **OK** button.

A **Cleaning** message displays on the product control panel. The cleaning process takes a few minutes to complete. Do not turn the product off until the cleaning process has finished. When it is finished, discard the printed page.

Visually inspect the toner cartridge for damage

- 1. Remove the toner cartridge from the product, and verify that the sealing tape has been removed.
- Check the memory chip for damage.
- 3. Examine the surface of the imaging drum on the toner cartridge.
 - <u>CAUTION:</u> Do not touch the roller (imaging drum) on the cartridge. Fingerprints on the imaging drum can cause print-quality problems.
- If there are any scratches, fingerprints, or other damage on the imaging drum, replace the toner cartridge.
- 5. If the imaging drum does not appear to be damaged, rock the toner cartridge gently several times and reinstall it. Print a few pages to see if the problem has resolved.

Check paper and the printing environment

Step one: Use paper that meets HP specifications

Some print-quality problems arise from using paper that does not meet HP specifications.

- Always use a paper type and weight that this product supports.
- Use paper that is of good quality and free of cuts, nicks, tears, spots, loose particles, dust, wrinkles, voids, staples, and curled or bent edges.
- Use paper that has not been previously printed on.
- Use paper that does not contain metallic material, such as glitter.
- Use paper that is designed for use in laser printers. Do not use paper that is designed only for use in Inkjet printers.
- Use paper that is not too rough. Using smoother paper generally results in better print quality.

Step two: Check the environment

The environment can directly affect print quality and is a common cause for print-quality or paper-feeding issues. Try the following solutions:

- Move the product away from drafty locations, such as open windows or doors, or air-conditioning vents.
- Make sure the product is not exposed to temperatures or humidity outside of product specifications.
- Do not place the product in a confined space, such as a cabinet.
- Place the product on a sturdy, level surface.

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- Remove anything that is blocking the vents on the product. The product requires good air flow on all sides, including the top.
- Protect the product from airborne debris, dust, steam, grease, or other elements that can leave residue inside the product.

Check other print job settings

When printing from a software program, follow these steps to try to resolve the issue by adjusting other print-driver settings.

Check the EconoMode settings

HP does not recommend the full-time use of EconoMode. If EconoMode is used full-time, the toner supply might outlast the mechanical parts in the toner cartridge. If print quality begins to degrade and is no longer acceptable, consider replacing the toner cartridge.

NOTE: This feature is available with the PCL 6 print driver for Windows. If you are not using that driver, enable the feature by using the HP Embedded Web Server.

Follow these steps if the entire page is too dark or too light.

- 1. From the software program, select the **Print** option.
- **2.** Select the product, and then click the **Properties** or **Preferences** button.
- 3. Click the Paper/Quality tab, and locate the Print Quality area.
- 4. If the entire page is too dark, use these settings:
 - Select the **600 dpi** option.
 - Select the **EconoMode** check box to enable it.

If the entire page is too light, use these settings:

- Select the **FastRes 1200** option.
- Clear the EconoMode check box to disable it.
- Click the **OK** button to close the **Document Properties** dialog box. In the **Print** dialog, click the **OK** button to print the job.

Try a different print driver

Try a different print driver when printing from a software program and the printed pages have unexpected lines in graphics, missing text, missing graphics, incorrect formatting, or substituted fonts.

Download any of the following drivers from the HP Web site. In the US, go to www.hp.com/support/ljM701 or www.hp.com/support/ljM706. Outside the US, go to www.hp.com/support. Select your country/region. Click Download Drivers & Software. Enter the product name, and then select Search.

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Solve wired network problems

Check the following items to verify that the product is communicating with the network. Before beginning, print a configuration page from the product control panel and locate the product IP address that is listed on this page.

- Poor physical connection
- The computer is using the incorrect IP address for the product
- The computer is unable to communicate with the product
- The product is using incorrect link and duplex settings for the network
- New software programs might be causing compatibility problems
- The computer or workstation might be set up incorrectly
- The product is disabled, or other network settings are incorrect

NOTE: HP does not support peer-to-peer networking, as the feature is a function of Microsoft operating systems and not of the HP print drivers. For more information, go to Microsoft at www.microsoft.com.

Poor physical connection

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- 1. Verify that the product is attached to the correct network port using a cable of the correct length.
- Verify that cable connections are secure.
- 3. Look at the network port connection on the back of the product, and verify that the amber activity light and the green link-status light are lit.
- 4. If the problem continues, try a different cable or port on the hub.

The computer is using the incorrect IP address for the product

- Open the printer properties and click the **Ports** tab. Verify that the current IP address for the product is selected. The product IP address is listed on the product configuration page.
- 2. If you installed the product using the HP standard TCP/IP port, select the box labeled **Always print to** this printer, even if its IP address changes.
- If you installed the product using a Microsoft standard TCP/IP port, use the hostname instead of the IP address.
- 4. If the IP address is correct, delete the product and then add it again.

The computer is unable to communicate with the product

1. Test network communication by pinging the network.

- **a.** Open a command-line prompt on your computer. For Windows, click **Start**, click **Run**, type cmd, and then press **Enter**.
- **b.** Type ping followed by the IP address for your product.

For Mac OS X, open the Network Utility, and then supply the IP address in the correct field in the **Ping** pane.

- **c.** If the window displays round-trip times, the network is working.
- 2. If the ping command failed, verify that the network hubs are on, and then verify that the network settings, the product, and the computer are all configured for the same network.

The product is using incorrect link and duplex settings for the network

Hewlett-Packard recommends leaving these settings in automatic mode (the default setting). If you change these settings, you must also change them for your network.

New software programs might be causing compatibility problems

Verify that any new software programs are correctly installed and that they use the correct print driver.

The computer or workstation might be set up incorrectly

- 1. Check the network drivers, print drivers, and the network redirection settings.
- 2. Verify that the operating system is configured correctly.

The product is disabled, or other network settings are incorrect

- Review the configuration page to check the status of the network protocol. Enable it if necessary.
- **2.** Reconfigure the network settings if necessary.

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
